## Statement on Kosher Slaughter in Canada

As many are now aware, the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA), the regulatory body which governs animal slaughter in Canada, introduced new guidelines governing animal slaughter in Canada that in effect – if not intention – place shechita (Jewish ritual slaughter) in jeopardy.

Since 1989, when then Prime Minister John Diferhabater's government passed the Humane Slaughter of Food Animals Act which approved sherhita as a humane method of slaughter, sherbita in Canada progressed unhindered. However, in June of 2023, the CFIA began enforcing new guidelines which render koshes slaughter nearly impossible to sustain. Since these new guidelines have gone into effect, the amount of kosher meat produced in Canadh as decreased dramatically. The community has been trying to temporarily supplement this shortfall with imported kosher meat, but this situation is not viable over the long-term.

Kosher slaughter is human. There is strong scientific evidence supporting this conclusion. Over the past few months, we have produced several reports from experts demonstrating that following shechita, animals rapidly transition to immediate and inversible inensibility and as a result of not experience any pain. Regretably, the CFIA has ignored the basic science, relying on inaccurate and flawed, selective literature review.

The Centre for Israel and Jeseish Affairs (CLA) together with the Jeseish Community Compiled of Montres (Mon afth the Ashirth Conscil of Canada (Oth) have been verying triefestly with industry stakeholders to try to reach a workable solution with the CFIA, but thus far we have been unsuccessful. While we have not abunded the defirit or secure a negotiated resolution that protects shechita and recognizes it as a legitimate and effective alternative to conventional captive boil straining. If that path does not result in meaningful progress, we will be forced to initiate legal proceedings.
