BOURBON:

If a company is Jewish owned, which is very common, there is an issue of "Chametz She'avar Alav HaPesach" (Chametz that remained in a Jew's possession over Pesach, Without being sold to a Non-Jew) which is forbidden for one to have any benefit from.





These are just a few examples of brands that are owned by Jews over Pesach and are not acceptable.

Buffalo Trace does have a special run certified by the CRC Chicago that says Kosher on it. This is not Kosher for Pesach. It is chametz. However, it is NOT "Chametz She'avar Alav HaPesach" (Chametz that remained in a Jew's possession over Pesach), and therefore it IS acceptable.

FLAVORS:

Any type of added flavor present in any alcoholic beverage including spiced rum or the like) requires it to have a reliable hashgacha.

BEER:

It's best to drink certified beers. Most uncertified unflavored beers



from the popular large scale brands are assumed kosher. The moment any flavor, lactose or other kosher sensitive ingredients are present it needs a Reliable Hashgacha. Even for unflavored beer, there can be equipment issues which render the beer not kosher. It is important to investigate if the brewery produces non-kosher flavored beers (oyster, bacon, clam, or lobster etc.) before consuming.

LIQUEUR

All liqueurs require a reliable hashgacha due to added flavoring.
